Religious Education (RE) Expectations for Home-schooled Students or Students Attending Catholic Schools

Dear Parents,

As with those families attending RE classes, our parish requires that all homeschool families register with the Religious Education Office in accordance with Arlington Diocese guidelines. Registering helps us contact families as we support and partner with you especially with sacramental preparation and continuing education beyond the sacramental years. To aid us with this purpose, we request the that your Registration to be completed by September 1 – Thank you!

Outside the Sacramental Years: If a family wishes to homeschool their children outside the sacramental preparation years, the parents must ensure that the curriculum and texts are identical or equivalent to those in use by the parish religious education program.

If a family chooses to homeschool their children in the non-sacramental years, the family must still register the student with the Religious Education Office so that we can be assured that religious instruction is occurring outside the "sacramental years."

During the Sacramental Years, all students of the parish are subject to the same and specific prerequisites, whether the students are attending public or private schools or are being homeschooled.

Parents of children in Sacramental preparation for First Penance and First Communion should attend all parent meetings pertaining to the sacrament. They children are required to attend a First Penance retreat and a First Holy Communion retreat, and practices as well as any specific Sacramental preparation requirements for that year.

Confirmation Prep begins in 6th grade. Confirmation Packets are given out at the "Student & Parent" meeting usually in early September of the 7th grade year. Please read the entire packet and turn in completed first four pages as soon as possible. Please pay attention to deadlines and turn requirements in on time to ensure that the process is a smooth one.

Parents of Children preparing for Confirmation should register and remain in contact with the Religious Education office for 6th, 7th, and 8th grade years. The home-schooled students will have the same sacramental preparation requirements (i.e. service hours, spiritual exercises, etc.) as the Catholic school students and the students in the religious education classes. Parents should attend any parent meetings regarding the sacrament. Confirmation candidates in the diocese are required to attend a Confirmation retreat and practice.

When it comes time for students to receive their sacraments, all recipients are comingled in the congregation. St. John the Evangelist is one community, one parish and one family therefore RE in-class students sit alongside Catholic school students and Homeschooled families.

Please note:

- All students in grades 1-12 are expected to be catechized and should be registered each year with Religious Education including those that are home-schooled or attend Catholic Schools. Registration deadline is before October 1st for this school year!
- The RE definition of Catholic home-schooled students are those being home-schooled in **all** academic subjects by their parents, not just religion.
- Home-schooling families are encouraged and welcomed to participate in our Religious Education classes.
 This can be a wonderful opportunity to foster a sense of community within the parish and interact with

other Catholic children in a controlled and caring environment. Of course, we would enjoy having parents ioin our volunteer team of Catechists as well.

- Why register? Registration with the RE Office is required by the diocese for all homeschooling families and it allows the parish and diocese to help support you as you grow your children in the faith and help them to receive their sacraments. The bishop is responsible for all souls in his diocese and this information allows him to know how many people are choosing homeschooling as their main means of religious education. By registering, the parish can ensure that their sacramental records are updated correctly and in a timely matter. This information is also reported to the Diocese which helps the Bishop develop programs and better care for his flock.
- "As the Chief Catechist in the Diocese, the Bishop is responsible for the total catechetical mission of the local Church. Catechesis is one of the Fundamental tasks of the Bishop's ministry. First of all, the Bishop is a catechist himself; he is a "herald of truth" (National Directory of Catechesis 54, Ch.8, p. 218)
- Sacraments are actions of the whole Church and not private devotions (CCC 116). Accordingly, it is the
 responsibility of the Pastor, in accord with the norms established by the bishop, to provide for the
 catechesis of all the faithful and to ensure that each Catholic is properly prepared for the reception of the
 Sacraments. (CCC 773-776)
- Sacramental preparation in our parish is two years for First Holy Communion (generally 1st and 2nd Grade)
 Confirmation is a three-year preparation in our parish (generally 6, 7 and 8). Students must be registered
 with the RE office during sacramental preparation years in order to receive their sacraments in a timely
 manner.
- It is the canonical responsibility of the Pastor to determine that all students have been properly
 prepared for the reception of the Sacraments. Even though Canon Law states the minimal
 requirements for the reception of the Sacraments, it also provides that pastors are to ensure "suitable
 preparation" which may take many forms.
- Although parents are the primary educators of their children, they are not the only educators of their children. Since the reception of the Sacraments of Eucharist and Confirmation are Sacraments of Initiation, they are ecclesial or parish events rather than only personal or private events. For this reason, they involve the parish in preparing children for these important sacraments. The parish program, therefore, is an important complement to religious education by the parents in the "sacramental years." It begins to insert a child organically into the life of the Church beyond the family or "domestic church" (Catechesi Tradendae 37).
- As Saint John Paul II stated, "It is true that catechesis can be given anywhere, but I wish to stress, in
 accordance with the desire of very many Bishops, that the parish community must continue to be the
 prime mover and preeminent place for catechesis...Family catechesis, therefore, precedes, accompanies
 and enriches all other forms of catechesis" (John Paul II Catechesi Tradendae 67).
- The texts in use in our curriculum have been approved by the Diocesan Office of Catechetics and carry
 the Imprimatur of the Church as well as the certification that they are in conformity with the Catechism of
 the Catholic Church.
- The Arlington diocese has published grade level curriculum guidelines. The material you cover in your homeschool should meet or exceed the diocese grade level requirements. As with other parishes in our diocese, our goals, in addition to educating children in the faith, are to support families in their journey towards sanctification and salvation, build a community of support amongst parishioners, encourage an attitude of service, and develop a missionary spirit that, emboldened by the Holy Spirit, will help us go forth and spread the Good News.

Let us pray for Christ's blessings on our Catechetical efforts. May God Bless you and your families as you strive to imitate the Holy Family at home or in class.
